UPCOMING SUMMIT

The Colon and Rectal Surgery Review Committee (RC) and the ACGME are in the process of rewriting the program requirements for colon and rectal surgery residents. A Scenario Based planning workshop occurred in March and an upcoming Stakeholder Summit is taking place on November 13th in Chicago. The purpose of the Summit is to assist the writing committee with requirements and the future of CRS training. More to come after the Summit.

RISING STAR AWARD

The Research Foundation of the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons Rising Star Award is seeking applications. This Rising Star Award provides funding for a trainee embarking on a career in colorectal surgery or a junior colorectal surgery faculty member to engage in a professional development opportunity. The goal is to develop a diverse group of colorectal surgeons with skills to advance the field across the domains of clinical practice, research, and education and ultimately become the next generation of national and international colorectal surgery leaders. The professional development plan should directly align with the applicant's goals.

Awardees may receive up to \$7,000 to be used for coach air travel, hotel accommodations, meals, and registration for a career development course, with residual funds available for direct research assistance.

Applications must be received by November 27th, 2023, to be considered for the 2024 grant cycle.
